MEETING: AARP does not meet December through March.

Membership in AARP keeps you informed about many issues that impact Americans 65 and older, so let's review a recent communication from AARP.

The following excerpt is from *Second Round of Medicare-Negotiated Price Cuts Expected to Save Billions in Drug Costs in 2027* by Tony Pugh from the November 25, 2025 AARP Bulletin:

The Federal Government announced Tuesday, November 25, fifteen additional expensive, widely used prescription drugs will have lower negotiated prices for Medicare beneficiaries in 2027. Approximately 5.3 million beneficiaries use those medications, counting towards \$40.7 billion in Medicare Part D spending. These drugs are used to treat conditions such as asthma, cancer, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), and diabetes. The expected results from the price negotiations is estimated to save \$8.5 billion to \$12 billion a year between drug companies and the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). The reduced prices must be made available to Medicare beneficiaries on January 1, 2027. Reduced prices must be made available to eligible Medicare beneficiaries along with being included with covered drugs for all stand-alone Part D plans available to people in original Medicare and Medicare Advantage prescription drug plans.

Approximately \$685 million of savings is expected for Medicare Part D out-of-pocket costs. Dr. Myechia Minter-Jordan, AARP's CEO, states that "Older Americans across the political spectrum consistently say that lower drug prices are a top priority, and these negotiated prices will bring meaningful relief to millions of people on Medicare."

The first round of Medicare drug price negotiations impacted 10 medications in 2024 and resulted in lower prices which will take effect in 2026. Medicare enrollees are expected to save \$1.5 billion in out-of-pocket costs in 2026.

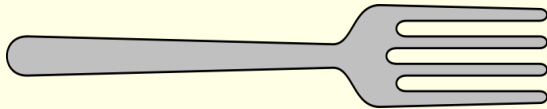
Monthly Luncheon Monday, February 2 12 Noon Lunch

The class fills quickly so hurry! Limits set.

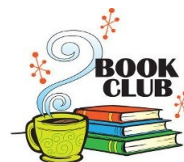

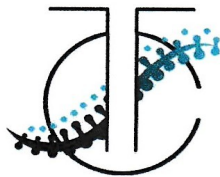
