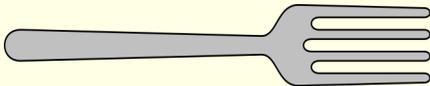
Monthly Luncheon Monday, April 6 Noon Lunch

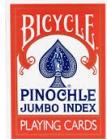
